But early childhood education consists of so much more than letters, numbers, shapes and colors. How about oral language, storytelling, critical and creative thinking, logical process, whole body movement, music and art experiences, the hand/eye/brain process, and encouraging the developing awareness of a "self" in relationship with our earth and a larger community with early science and social studies concepts?
